Protect your organization from insider accidental or malicious data loss

An accidental insider threat is unintentional loss caused by honest mistakes such as being tricked, procedural errors, or a degree of negligence. Being the victim of an email phishing attack is an accidental insider threat!

Follow your instinct and always report what does not look or feel right to you, whether it involves another employee or social engineering techniques from an outside party.



Protect your patient's protected health information and do not give out information unless you have *thoroughly* identified the requestor's identity!

Be sure to notify your IT security professional immediately if you experience accidental or malicious data loss.
